Poul-Erik Nielsen var en af verdens bedste doublespillere i årene omkring 1960 og vandt tre All England-titler i på hinanden følgende år med tre forskellige partnere: 1958 MD med Erland Kops, 1959 XD partnering Inge Birgit Anker Hansen og i 1960 igen MD, denne gang hos Finn Kobberø. Desuden nåede han finalen ved fem andre lejligheder mellem 1956 og 1964 – ingen ringe rekord, især i betragtning af, at han spillede samtidig med sin legendariske landsmand Finn Kobberø.



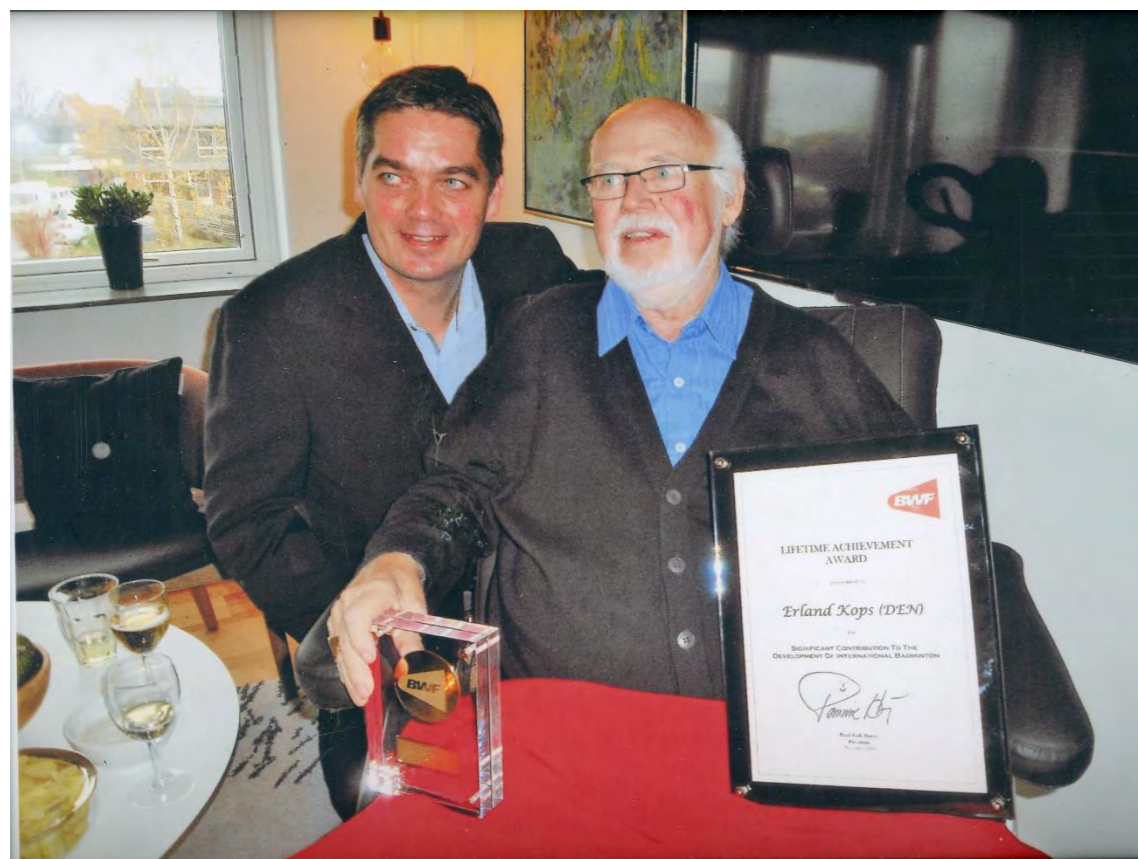

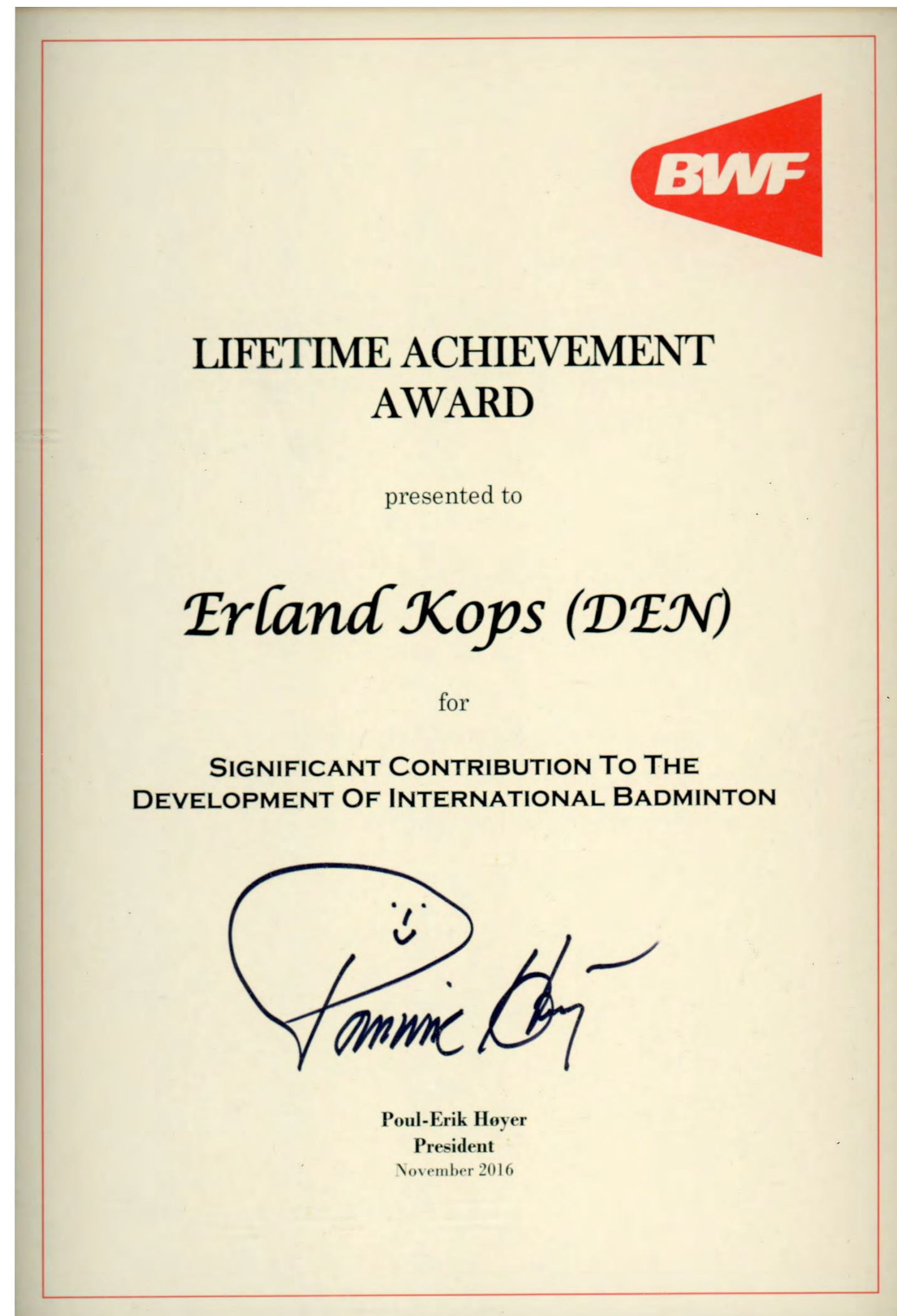

Hans Henrik Fløe indledte sin karriere som kasserer i Jylland og blev i 1988 indvalgt i DBFs bestyrelse, hvor han også fungerede som kasserer i en periode, hvor det gjaldt om at få rettet op på egenkapitalen. Han blev i 1992, efter at have forestået økonomien ved VM 1991 valgt som forbundets formand og blev den længst siddende formand hidtil. I hans formandsperiode blev forbundets organisation udviklet og moderniseret, og endnu et VM og Sudirman Cup i 1999 blev gennemført med succes. Hans Henrik Fløe's civile karriere førte til flere ledende poster i indenfor skatsektoren.

In 1947 the Scottish Badminton Union was invited by Kemsley Newspapers to stage an exhibition match in this Circus Arena, as part of a youth and recreation exhibition. It was successful enough to warrant the International Badminton Federation's invitation to stage the semi-final of the first Thomas Cup competition in 1949, and that unforgettable match between Malaya and the U.S.A. was probably the greatest ever played.

In succeeding years the Danes—these good friends of Scottish Badminton—sent their best players to play invitation teams, and your interest and support stimulated the Union to present its first World Invitation Tournament in November, 1951. That Tournament was seen by 18,000 people, cost more than £5,000 to promote and scraped home with a financial gain of £230. The gain in terms of national improvement and international prestige was more significant, and this Tournament is now established as one of the important events in world badminton ; invitations to compete are treasured by the greatest players in every country that the game is played.

Freeman, Wong Peng Soon, Ooi Teik Hock, Ong Poh Lim, the Choongs, Heah, Alston, Poul Holm, Skaarup, Smythe, Betty Uber, Tonni Ahm, Nichols, Peard and Fitzgibbon, Kirsten Granlund, Seth, Natekar and all the cream of world badminton in the past decade have played here for their pleasure and our delight. A few of these are still with us and are still great, but time has looked after most of them and their places are filled by the great players of this generation—Kobbero, Hamnergaard Hansen, Jordan, June Timperley, Iris Rogers, Margaret Varner, Judy and Sue Devlin, Best, Sonnevillie, Dahlberg and others.

Of the youngsters known to us who will in their day dominate the game, there are Oon Chong Teik, Kops, Neilsen, Bo Nilsson, Waddell and Heather Ward. All over the world others are developing. They will all come to Kelvin Hall ; for the trip, for the fun, for the glory and, above all, for the reason that you, the spectator, watch, appreciate and applaud, their great love for a great game.

Since the first badminton event at Kelvin Hall, costs have progressively increased but with the exception of final night tickets, admission prices have remained at the same level. Among the factors that have made this possible are the abolition of entertainment tax, agreement with the Badminton Association of England whereby cost of travel for distant overseas players is divided between their Association and ours, economical management and a predictable number of spectators. This Tournament was the first of its kind in the world of badminton and in our knowledge, badminton is the only game in which, year after year, the world's best players are to be seen in Scotland.

The Scottish Badminton Union has created a precedent and with your support in the years to come, it can establish a tradition.

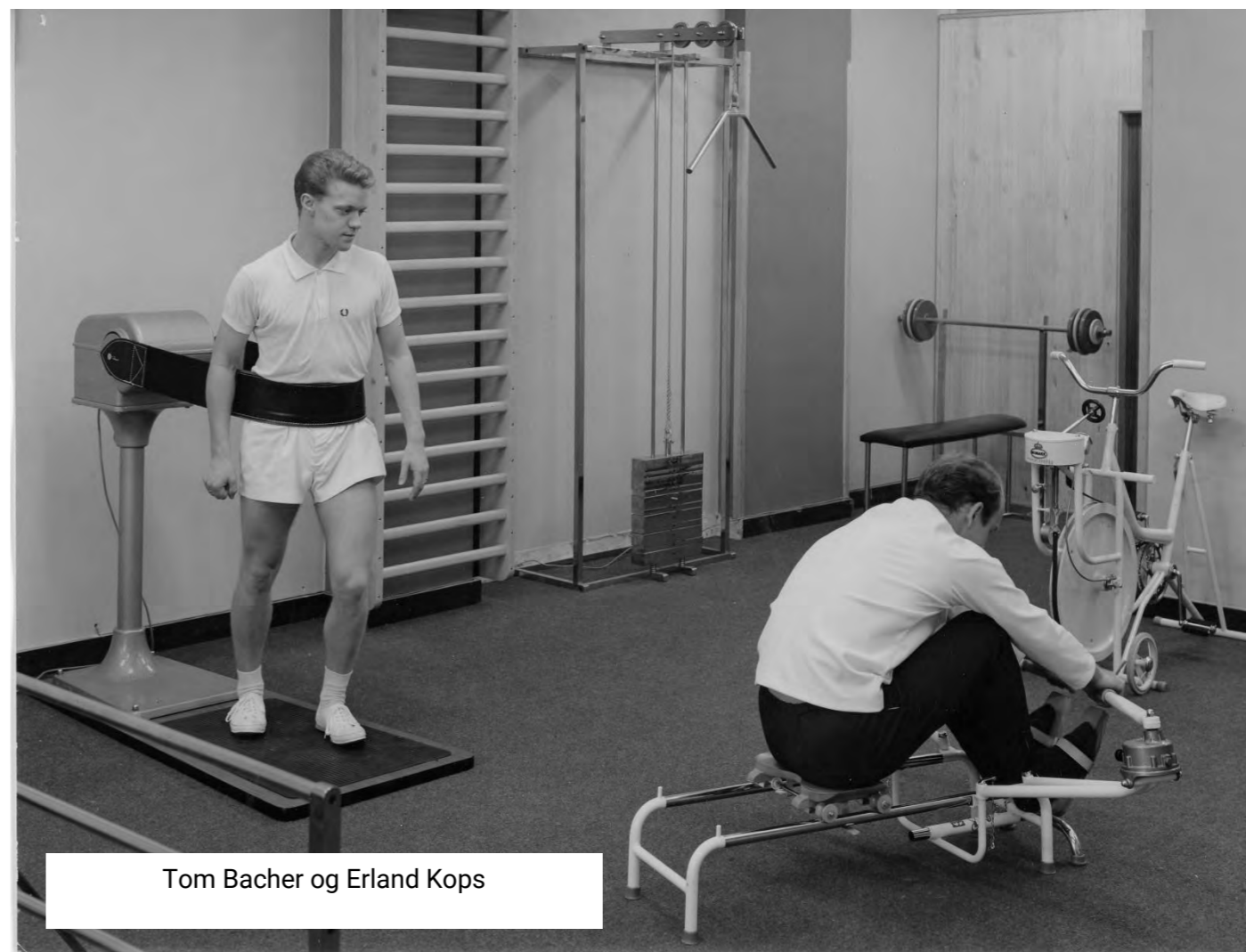
